- 2133 Buchanan S.W. Burton Junior High School. Burton Elementary and Middle School. Built in 1926, the school features a design common to schools of the era. The 3-story building had two sets of double-loaded corridors, with classrooms on both sides, closed on each end and separated by two courtyards. In 2007-08, crews gutted the interior and removed the narrow northern side, making it the new main entrance with a 2-story glass lobby that connects the classrooms to a community health center. An attached greenhouse now serves as a teachers' meeting area. Much of the beautiful terra cotta detailing was kept or moved in the renovation. The media center was crafted from one of the courtyards, and is capped by a pitched glass roof intended to bathe students in natural light as they study. The whole project cost \$24 million. Elementary capacity: 490. 2009-10 enrollment: 376. Middle school capacity: 720. 2009-10 enrollment: 431.
