

Fitzhugh Avenue, S.E.

98-112 Fitzhugh S.E. This cluster of eight white stucco, mission-style townhouses was built in 1913 by D. Emmett Welsh, and maintained as the Welsh Apartments until the building went condominium in 1948. Initially, the building was intended as a cooperative, similar to those Welsh had seen in Pennsylvania. All eight of the condos are similar in design, with three bedrooms, 1½ baths, and separate concrete and plaster basements complete with laundry. The two floors of living units are each about 800 square feet per floor.
