100 Hall S.W. Engine House No. 10 was put in service on March 2, 1897. It served as the quarters for an engine company until July 21, 1926, when a new station was opened at Division and Brown to better serve newly annexed areas south of Burton Street.



The building then served as the 3rd Precinct station for the Police Department until the mid-1950's, when it was sold for commercial purposes. During its time as a police precinct, it housed a desk sergeant, a detective bureau, a police ambulance, and even a lockup. (Old # 700. 401 Hall S.W. Organized in 1912 with an initial work force of 25, the Metal Office Furniture Company grew into Steelcase, Inc., one of the world's largest producers of metal office furniture and office systems. It is significant for its association with Frank Lloyd Wright and with the design and manufacture of the innovative office furniture that Wright designed for the Johnson Wax building in Racine, WI. This building was designated as Plants No. 2 and 3. With a rail spur coming in from the northeast across Century Avenue, it served as a Steelcase factory until the 1950's. It was home throughout the 1970's to Spee-Dee Checkout, Inc., a manufacturer of grocery store fixtures. Delta Properties, in partnership with Williams Distributing, took over the building in 1989 and subdivided it for use by multiple tenants.
