336 Henry S.E. This old 2-story frame house with a Michigan basement was listed for sale at only \$3,500 in 1977. William B. Borgers lived here in 1912. In 1948, owner and occupant was Mrs. Ella J. McHale, widow of James McHale, with her daughter Ethel McHale, who was a nurse at Receiving



Hospital. Ethel McHale was living here as sole owner in 1968.

419 Henry S.E. Henry School. Built in as a utilitarian brick box in 1919 as World War I came to a close, the school's most distinctive feature was an annex built in 1961 that had architects scratching their heads 40 years later. The wing of classrooms was linked to the main building by an exposed outdoor corridor, forcing students to parade through the boiler room and basement in inclement weather. The school went through a partial name change to Henry Paideia Academy in the 1990's, but nothing could be done to improve the building itself. Henry School was replaced in September, 2006, by the 3-story, 66,000-square-foot Martin Luther King Jr. Leadership Academy, nearly twice the size of the old school.
