84 *Mount Vernon N.W. This large 2-story flat was for many years the home of Civil War Gen. Stephen Gardner Champlin and his family. Champlin was born in Kingston, NY, on July 1, 1827. He moved to Grand Rapids in 1853, serving as judge of the recorder's court and then as Kent County prosecuting attorney. On June 10, 1861, he was mustered into federal service as major of the 3rd Michigan Infantry. He received a hip wound at the battle of Seven Pines in the spring of 1862, and ultimately died from its effects in Grand Rapids on January 24, 1864. He is buried in Fulton Street Cemetery. One of the early pieces of Grand Rapids fire equipment was named in his honor. Thomas J. Johnston and Edward P. Mills had apartments at this address in 1912. Mrs. A.M. Deutsch was the last resident before the house was razed for the US-131 expressway in 1959. (Original # 55. Old # 148.)*

136 Mount Vernon N.W. The Jackoboice House. Frances and Ruth Jackoboice were still living in this 2-story brick dwelling in 1954. The house



stood on a 50' x 60' lot on the southeast corner of Allen Street. On the first floor was an entrance hall, two living rooms, dining room, music room, kitchen, and half-bath. The second floor featured four extra large bedrooms, a large bath, and closets. A large side porch was built on the north or Allen Street side of the house. Floors throughout the house

were hardwood. The house was heated with oil and a forced air furnace. There was a brick 1½-stall garage. The Jackoboice family is one of the oldest of Polish descent in Grand Rapids. The family was associated with the Monarch Road Machinery Co. for many years. This fine house was razed for the US-131 freeway in 1959. (Photo: GRPL 287, July 20, 1954, No. H 603.)
