1250	Sigsbee S.E. Sigsbee School was built in 1906, part of a public school building program necessitated by Grand Rapids' growing population. It was built on a large plot of ground that had been occasionally used as a circus grounds and covered a full city block, but was twice as long as it was wide. The school itself was on a hill to the east, facing the sunrise. It was the first time in local school history that the thermostat system was installed as the building was being constructed. Heating was provided by steam boilers fueled by coal. Cost of the building was about \$65,000. Hardly any homes in the area were built before 1895. (G.R. <i>Press</i> , June 30, 1906, p. 5.)
